

#### REFLECTION

Arise! Shine! Your light has come – Isaiah 60:1

As the New Year begins with this reading for Epiphany, I laugh as I read it, remembering again, just how happy I was to be awoken in the early hours of December 24<sup>th</sup> with the power going back on.

What a Christmas we have just had! Little did we know as we began our Advent journey, innocently lighting the candles on our wreath, just how much some of us were going to have learned about light in the darkness by the time Christmas arrived.

At home and at the church power was lost during the ice storm on Sunday morning, December 22<sup>nd</sup>.We were almost forty eight hours before it came back on. For some of you, I know it went on even longer. Out came the candles and warm sweaters, board games and cards took the place of our laptops and televisions, gas fireplaces were turned on, barbeques fired up and for the first day or so it was an adventure. Up on Bloor Street, the coffee shops did a brisk business as people charged their phones and strangers became friends. Then the temperature in the house dropped past comfortable and our neighbours began to seek refuge with

friends who had power. We worried about those we knew who were older or who had young kids. The news said it could be days, maybe even a week, and for some in this city it was.

#### What a Christmas!

As I think about all we have been through I am reminded that when Jesus and the prophets spoke about light in the darkness, they were not talking about turning on electric light bulbs with the power to illuminate a whole room. Lamps in those days were often just a single wick floating in some oil, the flames no bigger than the candles we are now so much more familiar with.

This was the light that Jesus talked about. Held high it is just enough to illuminate your next footstep or see into your child's face and know if they are happy or sad. This is the light in the darkness. It doesn't reveal or lay everything open to examination but it gives us what we need.

I am thinking about that as we begin the New Year. What is the Light that you you have been looking for? The simple grace you need to take your next step? To reach out to your neighbour? It is here!

So Arise! Shine! Your light has come! Happy New Year, Rev. Karen
