December 1 - 7, 2019


Each week there is a bible text to read together as a family along with a child's version of the story from the *Spark Story Bible*. If your church follows the lectionary, you will hear each of these stories read in worship, and if your church uses the 'Spark Lectionary' curriculum you will hear these stories in Sunday School too. Repeating them again at home helps us remember each of the weekly themes that shape our waiting. Add a children's book or two along with a family movie and you have the opportunity for some great family conversations.

This week the prophet Isaiah brings a message of hope more than 500 years before the birth of Jesus. God promises them peace during a time of war; great hope for a day yet to come.





Christmas Day is not the end of the Christmas season.

No, Christmas actually lasts 12 days and ends with Epiphany on January 6. Remember the song The Twelve Days of Christmas? The 12 days of celebration and gifts actually start on Christmas Day and conclude with Epiphany. In the middle of these days we will hear about the Holy Family's flight to Egypt and read John's different telling of Jesus coming to the world.

Epiphany is the day we celebrate the arrival of the wise men who came from the East to worship and bring special gifts to Jesus.

So, keep enjoying the readings, stories, books and a movie during this season of Christmas.

Christmas Eve and Christmas Day December 24, and December 25, 2019





Advent Two - PEACE December 8 - 14, 2019





In the midst of our waiting we have a week of joy.





After answering, Jesus turns and tells the crowd that John is more than a prophet; he is a very special messenger sent by God to prepare the people for Jesus's coming. John lived differently than most people, but his message was one of joy for everyone.

Our books and our movie introduce us to some people who also lived differently. Two were very sad, and one very poor, and the Grinch didn't want anyone to have joy. Our waiting is almost over.




Has it been hard to wait?
